





Kindergarten

Wow, glad to be back to school and have all of our Kindergartners back in a routine. We have reviewed the rules, routines and what we were learning about prior to the storm. Moving forward we will continue to send home homework on Mondays and they are to be returned on Fridays. The homework is an extension of what we are learning in the classroom. Some will find the homework very simple and others will struggle with it. Please try not to do everything all in one night. We also encourage you to read with your child at least 20 minutes nightly. Since some of them still cannot read, have them point to the words as you read to them and even identify the words that they know on the page. This will encourage them to start reading with you and soon you will be listening to them read to you. In reading, we are focusing on becoming good readers by asking and answering questions about details within the text. We are continuing to work on letter recognition-upper and lowercase, sounds of the letters, and some beginning/ending sound identification. In math, we are working on identifying, counting and writing numbers 0-5. Science has us learning about using our senses and identifying the body part that matches the sense. We have also been learning about being kind to our classmates and being a good friend. We encourage you to sit down and talk about your child's day. At the dinner table, make one night a device free night. Go around the table and have everyone share about their day. Have some one-on-one time, encourage them to earn those points in their agendas. Remember our goal is a 4 but we strive for a 5 every day. Encourage your child to tell you about their new reading buddies, something funny that happened at school or even a joke. Thank you for allowing us to teach your Kindergartners!



Third Grade

We hope that you and your family are recovering quickly from hurricane Irma. We are back from our hurricane days and ready to keep working hard! In reading, we are focusing on the comprehension skill cause and effect. Ask your student to tell you some of the key words they have learned. In math we are working on multiplication facts and strategies. A fun way to study multiplication facts with your child is quizzing them in the car and making it a race. We are also learning about the water cycle science. Please make sure that your child completes their nightly homework assignments and reading log. We look forward to seeing you at Open House!



Fourth Grade

By now your child should be settling into the routines in their classroom. These routines make the learning processes flow smoothly so that everyone has a chance to be successful. Fourth grade teachers are in the process of trying to meet with each parent to share current assessment data on your child and provide you with an understanding of what we are working on in the classroom.

During the month of October we are jumping right into principles of multiplication. Students will be learning that there are many ways to do this. One important thing you can do to help is to practice the basic math facts with your child. Math fluency is an important part of math success.

During the Language Arts block, we are working on many different reading and writing skills. Students are asked to think deeply about the text they are reading and to share their thinking through their writing. You can help in this area too! Please encourage your child to read their library books and take AR tests. This is an important way for students to get the practice they need.

In science, we are exploring matter. Students are digging into the material, using scientific tools, and making observations about matter. They are having fun with hands on experiences to bring the curriculum to life. We look forward to meeting with each of you in the near future if we haven't met already! Thank you for sharing your children with us!



First Grade

Happy Fall! First grade teachers have been working diligently with their students to prepare them for the big changes that this month brings. In Reading your child will be asked to read and complete the reading test on their own. Teachers have taught the test taking skills to prepare our students for this. It is important that you read with your child 20 minutes daily to help them practice sounding out words. We also have practiced asking and answering questions about the words and pictures to help them understand the story better. In Math, we will move into adding and subtracting strategies using numbers 1-20. It is important your child is practicing this in their homework. Please let your child's teacher know if you have any questions. We appreciate all your support.



Fifth Grade

We have several activities and field trips coming up in October and November. If you are not yet an approved volunteer, fifth grade needs you! Casper's Birthday is Friday, October 27th. We need volunteers to help on Thursday to prepare for the celebration and more volunteers on Friday to help run the booths. Additionally, we have two field trips in November. We will be attending the WE3 Expo on either November 2nd or November 3rd. We also have our annual Turkey Bowl at Legion Field on Tuesday, November 14th. Each classroom needs three chaperones for each field trip to help make sure our students are safe while we are off campus.

In math, we are finishing our unit on Division and are diving into Fractions. Students must be able to fluently multiply if they are to be successful with fractions.

One fun activity to play at home is multiplication war. All you need is a standard deck of cards with the face cards and jokers removed. Aces have a value of 1.

Deal all cards. Players lay two cards face up and multiply them to find their value. The player with the highest value wins all of the cards for that hand. If players have the same value in one hand, they go to war! Each player lays three cards face down and then two cards face up. They multiply the face up cards. The player with the greatest value wins all 14 cards in that hand! Have fun playing!

Remember to sign your child's agenda every night! Encourage your child to read, or better yet, sit down and read a book with them! Have a fantastic month and stay safe!
